A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR OF TRUSTEES

Dear Supporter,

Thank you – seems to be the only way to begin. Through these months of challenge and turmoil, our supporters, staff and volunteers have done their best to make it possible for the Hospice to continue providing palliative and end of life care services for patients and families in Barnet, Enfield and Haringey.

What has been apparent throughout the last year, more than ever, is that the North London Hospice has a wealth of gifted and dedicated staff and loyal support from the communities we serve. The response to the appeals has been so positive and helped us through the loss of much of our fundraising income and the closure of our shops.

The fundraising team has produced imaginative and successful 'non-event' opportunities that have engaged the local community and delivered significant funds. Just one example of this is the way the Big Fun Walk, our biggest fundraiser of the year, was adapted to ensure people were still able to complete the event. More than 800 of you took part and raised over £85,000 for patient care.

We also had a very moving Light up a Life 'Virtual' Ceremony. Our first virtual experience of this much-loved occasion appears to have been a success and was joined by hundreds of families. Although it was very different to our usual gathering in terms of the contact and sharing of memories and reflections, it still brought us together to hold our loved ones in mind.

As well as the clinical challenges, the Estates and Facilities team also had to manoeuvre around logistical requirements to keep staff and patients safe, as well as manage the disappointment of having to stall the new kitchen development at Finchley. However, the good news is that the newly refurbished kitchen that so many of you made happen through your generous donations, finally opened in the autumn.

Although we are still in challenging times, there are glimmers of hope for everyone.

Our 'new' CEO has been in post now for six months, and Declan has engaged swiftly and effectively with the current challenges, and is looking ahead to a realistic and positive future for the Hospice.

We are optimistic that there will be a modified Proms at St. Jude's event this Summer in late June and you will once again be able to personalise our Big Fun Walk event in 2021 by walking in your local community on the weekend of 19/20 of June whilst remembering loved ones and/or raising funds to help us continue providing our care.

The challenges of the last few months have demonstrated the strength of the North London Hospice – its staff, its volunteers, its supporters and friends. We are committed to making it possible to continue to do what we were set up to do – to work together to make a difference to palliative and end of life care in our diverse communities.

We care for almost 3000 patients and their families each year, and I'm sure they will join us in thanking you for all that you have done, still do and will go on doing for the North London Hospice.

Our New Kitchen Is Cooking Up A Storm

Thanks to our wonderful supporters who contributed to our Kitchen Appeal, we are delighted to announce that the brand new catering facility is now up and running at our Finchley site.



Our kitchen provides all meals for 338 patients and their families each year and was in desperate need of replacement when we launched our appeal in 2018.



The generosity of our community was fantastic – the appeal raised £170,000 - and the refurbishment got underway in March 2020 - which we later discovered would become the most challenging year in living memory.

But this journey has a happy ending and the new kitchen is now equipped to cater for our patients, families, staff & volunteer needs now and in the future. Two Rational Electric Ovens are among the improved facilities, and have enabled the kitchen to become gas free, reducing the fire risk. The ovens also allow for steam cooking, a more efficient & healthy way

of cooking. The new staff café -which feeds the 229 staff and 214 volunteers at Finchley - has a fresh and



modern feel and is equipped with new seated and bar furniture, two microwave ovens and a chilled server stocked with takeaway foods and a salad bar.

None of this would have been possible without your support, so thank you for your generosity.

Launch of Local Hospice Lottery Partnership

We are delighted to announce a brand-new partnership with Local Hospice Lottery, which will help provide vital funds for patient care and give supporters the chance to win cash prizes!



Our new Lottery offer is a really easy way to support the hospice and one entry into the weekly draw costs just £1 per week. New Health & Wellbeing Activities

Our Health & Wellbeing Team continue to support our patients with a variety of regular sessions that are good for mind, body and soul, adding new classes to the programme in the Spring.

A series of Sleep Hygiene Hypnotherapy sessions began in February and our first online mindfulness course is on offer every Wednesday from 3-4pm, which patients can attend via Zoom.



Our Music Therapist has just started a new online Community Choir for all, which not only encourages people to sing but also provides an opportunity for those



who play musical instruments to join in too.

Look out for an announcement about a new online Horticultural Group, which we hope to start in the spring.

These new sessions from our Health & Wellbeing Centre are in addition to the now established online group activity, which includes three exercise groups – wellbeing, seated & standing – our Breathlessness & Fatigue course, sessions for those with neurological conditions, Sing-a-long Group, Yoga and Relaxation sessions.

New In-Patient Unit Virtual Tour

A brand new virtual tour of the In-Patient Unit at our Finchley site is now available for patients and their families to view.

The 12-minute video provides a look at the unit, communal areas and facilities in a patient room. Plus there's insights from our catering team on food preparation and nutrition and one of our specially trained ward volunteers.




It is hoped the virtual tour will help patients and families visualise the inpatient unit at this time when visiting is very restricted.

"One Day We'll Meet Again" Devoted Aunt Who Inspired A Song



A vibrant, loving fashionista with a raucous laugh... that's how family and friends remember Karen Akinosho. A devoted mum, wife, aunt, sister, daughter and friend.


Dental Practice Manager Karen lived in Enfield with husband Yomi and daughter Jasmine and five years ago was diagnosed with the autoimmune disease, Scleroderma.

"Throughout her illness she never let it get her down, always had hope and never dwelled on it," said Karen's sister Beverly. "Karen and I were really close. She was very vibrant and had a raucous laugh. She was always immaculate and dressed to the nines – even to put the bins out! She was a real fashionista."

In 2020, at the height of the pandemic, Karen was referred to North London Hospice and was cared for at home by our Enfield Community Team before being admitted to our in-patient unit at Finchley for respite care last October.

Husband Yomi explained:

"Karen was visited every week by the hospice's nurse Tricia Anderson, who was so supportive and also the physio Rob Fairclough, who helped her. When she went in to stay at the hospice in Finchley. Karen was surprised when she first arrived. She was scared, but when she came in I remember her saving 'This is really nice and modern. and the staff are so helpful.' Her room was lovely and we were all made to feel comfortable. It was like a modern hotel room! I stayed the night and I really can't fault the support we had. The staff made us feel at ease and not a burden in any way."





The pandemic poses huge challenges for hospices, which care for some of the most vulnerable people in communities across the UK, and in order to keep people safe, visiting to North London Hospice's in-patient unit has been very restricted.

"At that time we were able to come into the hospice, but only two people at a time," explained Beverly. "It was tough not being able to visit more as the whole family wanted to spend time with Karen, but we understood the reasons why and we knew she was being cared for well. We were also lucky that our mum was able to visit regularly; she would sit with Karen and sing to her."

Karen came to the in-patient unit for a second time a few weeks later. Yomi was constantly by her side. On the afternoon of 14 November 2020, Yomi left the hospice briefly to get changed and pick-up Karen's mother Yvonne, and unfortunately whilst he was gone Karen died peacefully with her sister Donna and nephew Dion at her side.

Yomi concluded:

"We had preconceptions of a hospice as being just for end of life care but it's not always what you think. It's nothing like a hospital. It was a blessing that Karen came into the hospice and we got to spend time with her, even during the pandemic, when so many restrictions were in place."





Poignant Tribute

Apart from Karen's devotion to daughter Jasmine and husband Yomi, the other "love of her life" was her nephew Dion Joseph. "I grew up with Aunty Karen. I had sleepovers, we watched TV together or went shopping to Enfield Town. She was always there for me. She encouraged me to follow my dreams. I studied music at university and now work at a music college."

The night before Karen died, Dion wrote a beautiful song in tribute to his aunt called "Meet Again" which was played at her funeral and has now been released as a single with proceeds being donated to North London Hospice.

"It was my way of expressing my feelings. 'Meet Again' debuted at No 93 on the iTunes chart – sandwiched between Justin Bieber at 92 & Celine Dion at 94. Aunty Karen would have been chuffed to bits with that!" said Dion.

Michelle Mandler
is a Specialist
Physiotherapist. As part
of the North London
Hospcie Health &
Wellbeing Centre team
she helps patients to
both maintain function
or rehabilitate

She offers a range of sessions, both group and 1 -2-1, from seated exercise to breathlessness and fatique classes.

"I see a lot of patients with physical impairments as a result of their illness. This could be loss of muscle or breathlessness, and together we look at ways to maximise their function through exercise."

Michelle's work can be hugely rewarding, enabling patients to achieve life goals after receiving support from her. Whether it's a last family cruise or the chance to get back on a horse, Michelle has helped patients make their dream a reality.

"If people have something they want to aim for we support them to try to make that happen. I had a

patient with a lung condition and she and her husband loved to cruise and wanted one last trip together. She found it difficult to walk any distance without gasping so her aim was to be able to get from the cabin to the dining room. That was her goal and enough for her to enjoy the holidav. We worked on her breathlessness and I was delighted that she was able to enjoy a wonderful last cruise with her husband.

"On another occasion I worked with a very resilient young lady who had mobility issues but wanted to ride a horse again. We got to the stage where she was able to pat and then sit on a horse.

"It's very rewarding when you can help someone get back to doing what they love."

Michelle moved to the UK from her native Australia six years ago and joined NLH in 2016 after working as a locum at other hospices. "Working within a hospice setting pulls together a broad range of skills.

"No matter where you are in life there are always things that are important to you. If I can help a patient achieve their goals it's very satisfying. But you never know what's important to someone until you ask."

It Was All About Dad



93-year-old tailor Martin Miller from Southgate spent his last two weeks at North London Hospice's in-patient unit in

Finchley, where he was peaceful, pain free and surrounded by the love of his family and his favourite music.

"It was all about dad," said daughter Joanne Miller. "You just don't realise what goes on within a hospice until you experience the care. It's such a different environment to a hospital."

14-years ago Joanne didn't know what a hospice was until a chance visit to drop off a birthday donation. "It was so different to what I expected and

I wanted to be part of it. I've now been a volunteer for 13 years."

But even as a volunteer, Joanne says she didn't really appreciate the support the hospice provides to a family until her family experienced it for themselves. "When dad came in I saw what really went on, on the other side. We were all taken care

of. At the end the nurses played music he enjoyed and he passed away peacefully and with dignity. We were at peace and dad wasn't suffering."



"The hospice

took care of the practical things afterwards and made it as stress free as possible for us. Knowing they were there for us all, was such a comfort."

Our Impact In Our North London Community

As we reach a year since the pandemic began, we reflect on the most challenging year North London Hospice has ever faced. Our end of year financial report that was published in March 2020 recorded the positive news that we had increased the number of patients we care for in the community by 24%. And we're pleased to say that we have managed to continue caring for this increased number of patients throughout the pandemic.

The growing need for good palliative and end of life care was evident before the pandemic but that need has grown throughout the last year. And with that demand goes the need for a charity such as ours to receive continued financial support from our community.

With our calendar of fundraising events cancelled for 2020 and our shops closed for much of the year, you rose to the challenge and continued to support us in any way you could. We wanted to show you what a difference your support and generosity makes.

Although the pandemic has had an impact on our care and meant we have changed the way some of our services are delivered, we wanted to share some of the positive impacts we made in the financial year from April 2019 up until March 2020.



- •24% the increase in Community Nursing patients cared for.
- $\bullet 3\%$ the increase in admissions on Inpatient Unit.
- •14% the increased number of referrals accepted for our Outpatient services.
- •99% of patient's friends and family were extremely likely or likely to recommend our service to friends or family.
- 3,958 the number of referrals to North London Hospice (5% increase on 2018/19).
- 10,770 the number of hours of care provided by our Community team.

We increased our capacity to care for more people in the community within North Central London during 2019 as part of a two-year pilot project, and the NHS reported a significant reduction in end-of-life hospital admissions:



- 27% The reduction in end-of-life hospital admissions across the 5 Boroughs in North Central London because of our Hospice at Home & Sustainable Transformation Programme.
- £2.7 million the saving to the NHS system because of this 27% reduction

This year we are expecting to provide care to more than 3,000 patients, their carers and families - more people than we have ever cared for before. As the pandemic continues, so does the tireless work of our nurses, doctors and care staff. They will continue to provide our vital palliative and end of life care across North London and we continue to need your help to do this.
