Nationally recognised qualifications are available from level 2 to five, with a range of clinical and non-clinical subjects.








Level 3 Certificate in Assessing Vocational Achievement

CAVA

As a result of the changes to nurse education we are pleased to introduce the CAVA qualification to ensure quality ongoing support and supervision of all learners



The Level 3 Certificate in Assessing Vocational Achievement (CAVA) is for people that want the qualification to assess in the classroom or work environment. This includes, but is not limited to, Health & Social Care.

Since the NMC quashed the mentorship programme many nurse mentors have found themselves at a loss as to how best to assess and support their staff. A CAVA course could be the answer

Learners will understand the different types of assessment and how effective assessing is vital in guiding candidates through the learning pathway.

Candidates will gain the skills and knowledge to evaluate practitioners carrying out assessments in the classroom and work environment as well as gain a nationally recognised assessing certificate, with the flexibility to assess in both the work and classroom environments.

Level 5 Award in Palliative Care Awareness

This 2 day course for registered nurses and health care professionals of a similar level has been developed by North London Hospice to offer learners a new and exclusive nationally recognised qualification in Palliative Care awareness.

The course will provide the learner with a comprehensive knowledge and understanding to provide high quality care to patients and their families in the palliative phase of their illness.

This qualification provides the opportunity to develop an understanding of different perspectives of death and dying and the impact it has on individuals.

It covers the aims and principles of end of life care, communication skills and how to access a range of support services in end of life care.

An ideal course for health care assistants, care home staff or anyone working within end of life care.

Candidates will receive a nationally recognised level 2 qualification on successful completion of a workbook.

Clinical Skills

We offer a range of practical and clinical skills training for use in healthcare settings.

Dates and times are flexible dependent on the needs of the organisations and can be delivered in-house, virtually or within one of our training rooms at our hospice sites. Please contact us for further information.



Syringe Driver

2 hour sessions include understanding the rationale for syringe driver use in palliative care, an awareness of medications commonly used in syringe drivers and how to safely set up and monitor the CME T34 syringe driver.

3 hour sessions will also include symptom control and the use of syringe drivers.

Following training learners will be able to discuss the rationale with patients and their families.

Please note that participants will need to be assessed for competency within their own workplace.



Clinical Record Keeping & Documentation - 2 hours

This short course is aimed at both registered and non-registered care staff. It will explore the legal requirement for accurate record keeping alongside the need to ensure that the patient's voice is heard. The course will encourage discussion around issues such as 'fact' and 'opinion'; how documentation makes a difference to the patient's experience and whether how we document care could be more efficient.

Advance Care Planning - 2 hours

This course is aimed at health and social care practitioners working with individuals with life limiting conditions. The course will develop understanding of the importance of the role of ACP in providing quality care. It will examine the legal and ethical principles that may need to be considered and focus on the communication skills required to hold these often challenging conversations.



DNACPR - 1 Hour

This short course is aimed at registered nurses who wish to improve their knowledge, understanding and confidence in relation to DNACPR decision making. The rationale and guidance behind DNACPR decisions will be explained and clarified. Participation will be encouraged with opportunities to discuss issues and case studies from practice.

Verification of Expected Death (VoED) - 2 Hours (plus ½ hour online pre reading)

This short course is for registered nurses. The aim of the course is to equip you with the knowledge and skills to verify an expected death. Candidates will be expected to complete a short e learning module with pre course reading prior to undertaking the face to face course. The face to face course will consolidate the e learning and provide an opportunity to practice the skills required in a supportive environment.

These sessions are ideal for care homes and can be delivered in your care home or at one of our hospice sites either singularly or combined as a whole study day!

Confident Conversations in End of Life Care

Effective communication skills are fundamental to providing high quality care for people approaching the end of their lives and to properly support those close to them. There is, however, much evidence to suggest that the healthcare workforce lack confidence and skills when discussing end of life care. This foundation study day explains the importance of good communication, explores barriers to and methods of communication and culminates in the opportunity to practice dealing with difficult conversations.

Namaste Care

Namaste Care is an experiential course designed for anyone caring for those with end stage dementia.

Namaste is a Hindu term meaning to 'honour the spirit within'. The Namaste Care programme was developed by Professor Joyce Simard to meet the needs of people with advanced dementia. The programme is based around the five senses, using music, massage, colour, tastes and scents, to connect with people and focus on wellbeing. No additional staff, space or expensive equipment is required.



Summer & Autumn Schools

Finding experiences and learning opportunities when exploring potential career paths can be difficult as a teenager. North London Hospice has therefore designed this 2-day workshop run during school holidays which allows learners to experience the work environment of the hospice, meet members of the health care team and enhance their CV.

Training for Care Homes

It has never been more important to ensure that care home staff are equipped and have the confidence to provide quality end of life Care.

Six Steps

Delivery of high quality end of life care in care homes and by home care providers is a national priority. The number of people requiring these services will be growing in the future and it is important that providers have staff trained to deliver end of life care and systems in place which support residents and clients to feel supported and experience their last months, weeks and days in the best way possible.

The Six Steps Programme is a series of workshops, based on the National End of Life Care Strategy (2008), designed to provide care homes with a toolkit to provide quality end of life care that meets CQC end of life essential standards. The course also provides staff with an ongoing commitment as an End of Life Care Champion, enabling them to share knowledge and skills to peers and colleagues.

The course provides the opportunity for up to three key people in your organisation to attend workshops and video conferences to learn about end of life care, to review your organisational systems and to build a resource of evidence to demonstrate quality care. The workshops will be followed by a consolidation period to allow embedding of learning and completion of assessment criteria. The application to attend the course must be made by the Manager or Owner of the service who will be fully informed of content and progress.

European Certificate in Essential Palliative Care (ECEPC)

Developed at Princess Alice Hospice in 2001, over 5,000 European candidates have now completed this highly respected qualification. The course is offered at a range of sites both nationally and internationally and we are pleased to announce that this year it will be available at North London Hospice. The ECEPC is an eight week distance learning, multi-professional programme, suitable for doctors, nurses and associated healthcare professionals who have direct contact with patients requiring a palliative approach. All candidates are provided with an extensive course workbook, access to a comprehensive virtual learning site and are assigned a facilitator to support them through the course.

Topics covered include:

- What is palliative care and who is it for?
- Symptom issues in palliative care
- · Patients with emergency conditions
- Breaking bad news to patients and families
- Bereavement and support
- Common ethical issues

NOTES	Candidates will be required to complete a course workbook and saccess the virtual learning site between launch and assessment dates.	

Assessment includes: A 2500 word portfolio based on a patient the candidate has cared for with palliative care needs. A one-hour written examination and a Viva, consisting of a short verbal assessment exploring the knowledge and skills developed during the course. There may be some changes to the format of the written and practical exams due to any on-going COVID-19 restrictions. It is recommended that 50-hours of personal study are carried out.



Staff working in hospices and care homes in the UK can apply to the Wolfson Foundation (via Hospice UK) to cover part of the cost of this programme. See Hospice UK for more details.
